Proclamation

WHEREAS, in Washington State, RCW 11.125.400 allows individuals to name a durable power of attorney for health care and RCW 70.122.030 provides the specifics for a health care directive, offering a model form for patient use; and

WHEREAS, healthcare organizations across Washington state are assisting people to plan ahead for future healthcare decisions in the event that they are unable to make their own medical decisions and to encourage the use of advance directives to communicate these important health care decisions; and

WHEREAS, only 24 percent of people in Washington state have executed an advance directive; and it is estimated that less than 50 percent of severely or terminally ill patients have an advance directive; and

WHEREAS, a significant reason for these low rates may be a lack of knowledge and considerable confusion about advance care planning and advance directives; and

WHEREAS, Healthcare Decisions Day is designed to inspire, educate, and empower the public and providers about the importance of advance care planning and encourage physicians and their care teams, medical groups, hospitals and health systems, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, continuing care retirement communities, and hospices to participate in a statewide effort to provide clear and consistent information to the public about advance care planning; and


WHEREAS, conversations about health care decisions and the execution of advance directives that make patients' wishes known will mean that fewer families and health care providers will have to struggle with making difficult health care decisions in the absence of guidance from the patient;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Inslee, Governor of the state of Washington, do hereby proclaim April 16, 2018, as

in Washington, and I encourage all people in our state to join me in this special observance.
